DISCLAIMER: Momentum Management's Safety Protocols are guidelines obtained through research by our operations teams for each venue. These protocols are our current understanding of the safety guidelines. For more information, please contact the show management venue directly for we believe there is potential for subtle changes per show and/or venue depending on the city.

The 2 main Cleaning Protocols going into place at major venues across the county are currently GBAC-STAR and Venue Shield. Below is a quick breakdown of the two, where they are being applied and what other protocols, regulations and requirements to expect that have been put into place.

GBAC - STAR: This accreditation means that a facility has established and maintained a cleaning, disinfection, and infectious disease prevention program to minimize risks associated with infectious agents like the novel coronavirus (SARS-CoV-2). Issued By ISSA.

Venue Shield: A comprehensive program being deployed at more than 325 ASM Global facilities around the world in partnership with leading medical professionals, industry experts and public health officials. Issued by ASM Global and in use at all venues Managed by ASM Global.

CDA will follow local health orders for CDA Presents. Independent contractors must enter the Moscone South Center from the 3rd Street entrance at the Blue Loading Dock. Prior to entry into the building, individuals will be required to provide proof of full vaccination along with government issued picture ID to security at the door. Present the original COVID-19 vaccination card or other digital image of the vaccination card stored on an electronic device. Independent Contractors' installing/dismantling for exhibitors who confirmed participation by applying for exhibit space application prior to August 12 may present negative test results taken within 72 hours prior to entry. It is the individual's responsibility to present an approved test result. Each personnel will be issued a wristband to be worn during all times at the convention center. Masks are required while installing/dismantling booths and may only be removed if actively drinking or eating.
